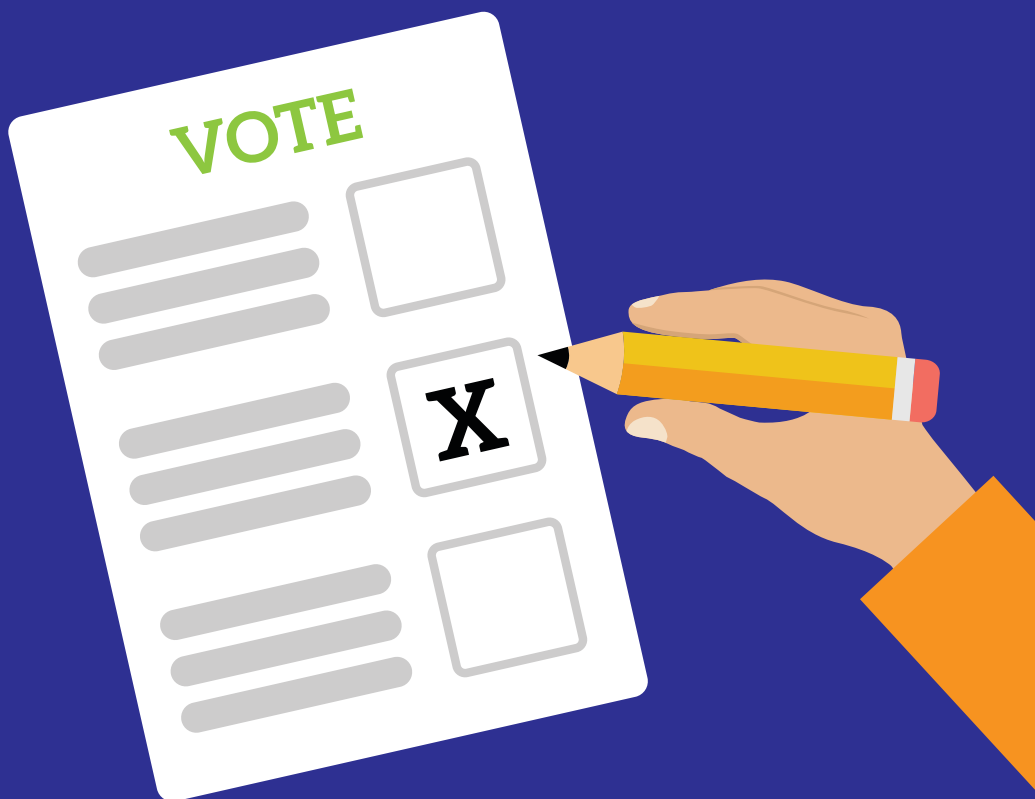


Voting Passport

For people who need some support voting in the elections



Before going to the polling station to make your vote, fill this out. Show it to somebody who works at the polling station when you arrive.

- I have a learning disability and/or autism
- I need a bit of support to help me to vote in the general elections

Tick the things that sound like you:

- I'd like to stay with my support worker when I make my vote
- I don't like waiting in long queues
- I don't like going into small spaces like the polling booth

Write down anything else that you think might affect you when you are voting or make it difficult to vote:

To make your vote you will need to put a cross next to the person's name you have chosen on the ballot paper and then put your ballot paper in the voting box.

- I need someone to mark my vote on the ballot paper for me

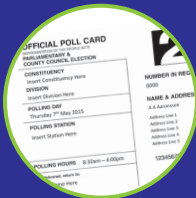
Write down who you would like to support you to make your vote (that might be your support worker or a family member)

Ask that person which of these describes them and tick that box:

- They are eligible to vote in the UK
- They are not eligible to vote in the UK (*this means a Presiding officer will also need to support me to make my vote*)



Stuff you might need to bring to the polling station with you:



Your polling card
– you should get that in the post before voting



Your ID -
a passport or birth certificate



A copy of a letter with your address
on it like a bank bill or electricity bill

What you should know about voting and your rights



How other people can support you:

- ✓ Someone can explain the ballot options to you
- ✓ Someone who understands how you communicate can use this to judge who you want to vote for
- ✓ Someone can come into the polling booth with you if you like
- ✓ Someone can mark the ballot paper with your decision

What other people can't do:

- ✗ Nobody can make a decision for you
- ✗ Nobody can mark the ballot paper for you without your permission
- ✗ Nobody can stop me from voting because I have a learning disability
